## Fireworks

Please ensure that children are appropriately supervised when using fireworks, particularly if using sparklers or if they will be out after dark. This way we can ensure that everyone has fun and stays safe this holiday.

Only adults should light fireworks and deal with firework displays. Make sure you dispose of used fireworks safely.

- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it has not gone off, it could still explode.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Stand well back. Light fireworks at arm's length using a taper.
- Keep fireworks in a closed inflammable box.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Only buy fireworks that comply with British Standard 7114 or its European equivalent. Instructions should be in English and must be followed.
- Never throw fireworks or put them in your pocket.
