First Aid Reporting

The way we inform you of an accident will look different as you will receive a printed sheet which is taken from our school information system. This means that you will receive an exact copy of the records we have stored. This will be printed on white paper, not on green.

If your child has a bump to the head they will also be given a red wristband to wear with the date of the incident noted on it. This is to ensure that all adults will be aware and will be able to monitor your child. It should also mean that we reduce the risk of paper slips getting lost.

As always, we welcome your feedback if our new systems do not quite work as expected.



Safeguarding

We ask that all adults stand away from the classroom doors, behind the line/drain, to enable adults to welcome and dismiss our children safely. Developing independence is an important part of learning at school and so children should be working towards getting into their classrooms independently.

In order to ensure that our site is secure, please make sure that you have left the school by 8.55am in the mornings so that the gates can be locked.
