### Dismissal of children at the end of the School Day

It is also important that children are collected on time. If you are unavoidably delayed when collecting your child, please remember to keep in touch with the School Office so that we are informed. As part of our safeguarding procedures, the adult who arrives at school will be asked to sign out using our Inventry system before they take the child.

### Headlice

Please remember to regularly check your child's hair for any signs of headlice. If you see lice or eggs, your child's hair must be treated with solution which can be bought at the supermarket or pharmacy. The treatment must be applied as directed on the box/bottle. The children are able to attend school whilst the treatment is being carried out, headlice will not be accepted as a valid reason for absence.
